Eligibility for Summer School  
Students are eligible for admission to summer school if they have 50% or better for a final grade in the course. Prior administrative approval must be obtained for grades lower than 50%.

Registration  
D-Y students needing summer school courses are urged to register early in order that a particular class will have sufficient enrollment to be offered and to insure their seats in the class. D-Y students will have preference over other students for available class seats. Registration for all classes will close on Thursday, July 2nd at 12:00 noon. Registration for all summer school courses will be at the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School, 210 Station Avenue, South Yarmouth, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, Monday through Friday.

### **Grade Reporting – Interim Reports**

Teachers will send bi-weekly (weeks 2 and 4) reports home with students giving a brief summary of progress and grade status.

Final grades will be reported upon completion of the program.

Grades of D-Y students will be forwarded to Guidance on August 14<sup>th</sup>.

The grades of all other students will be forwarded both to their designated school and their winter home address.

### **Courses Requiring Make Up in Summer School**

Failures in the following courses can only be made up in an approved summer school program. Please check with your teacher and/or guidance counselor.

ENGLISH: English 9, 10, 11, 12

MATHEMATICS: Integrated Algebra and Integrated Geometry

SCIENCE: Environmental Science and Biology

SOCIAL STUDIES: World History 9, U.S. History 10, 11

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Health/Physical Education

### **Attendance Requirements**

The maximum absence limit in summer school is three (3) days. Two (2) tardies will equal one (1) absence. A tardy of more than thirty (30) minutes is considered an absence. Any combination of absences or tardies which exceeds the maximum absence limit will result in the forfeiture of graduation credit. Students who earn a passing grade will still earn distribution credit.

### **Discipline**

All regular school-year behavioral guidelines apply to the summer school program. There are no Saturday School options during summer school. Smoking is prohibited on school grounds at all times. Disruptive and/or inappropriate behavior will result in suspension and loss of credit. Fees will not be refunded for any student who is dropped from the program.

### **Student Free Time**

Designated study areas will be available during each summer school session. Students may only be in areas of the school used by the summer school program.

### **Student Parking and Pick-Up/Drop-Off**

All students who drive to summer school must park in the back parking lot in the designated student section. Students are expected to drive in a safe manner and to obey traffic safety rules at all times. Students and their vehicles may be banned from school grounds because of disciplinary infractions.

Students who are dropped off or picked up are asked to meet their rides in the back parking lot of the school. Student and parent cooperation will greatly ease the congestion at the main office entrance which is heavily used in the summer by visitors and school staff.

## Course Offerings

Due to either lack of enrollment or availability or staff any of the following courses may be canceled or offered only during a single session. In the event that a course is to be offered during one session only, the session in which it will be offered will be announced and posted in the summer school office prior to the beginning of summer school.

## Credit

The student who will be repeating courses they have failed during the regular school year will receive the full course credit upon the successful completion of all course requirements (including attendance) and receipt of at least a "C" as stipulated in the "Credit Make-Up Programs" section of Academic Offerings 2008-2009.

## Grading

In the D-Y summer program only three grades ("A" "B" and "C") will allow a student to receive credit for the year's course. A grade of "D" Or "F" will not earn credit! NO pluses (+) or minuses (-) will be used in summer school grading.

For the student who received an "F" during the regular school year, the following will apply when combining the school year grade ("F") with the summer school grade.

1. If a student receives a grade of "C" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "D."
2. If a student receives a grade of "B" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "C-."
3. If a student receives a grade of "A" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "C."

For the student who received a "D" during the regular school year, the following will apply when combining the school year grade ("D") with the summer school grade.

1. If a student receives a grade of "C" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "C-."
2. If a student receives a grade of "B" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "C."
3. If a student receives a grade of "A" in the summer program, the combined grade will be a "C+."
